Barracks in the woods, 2 kilometers from Kielce

- Size of the camp:
 Ca. 30 hectares and 6,000 square meters
- Date of establishment of the camp: 8 September 1939
- Date of closure of the camp:
 15 November 1939
- 6. Were the prisoners only Poles, only Jews from Poland, or Poles and Jews from Poland?

Only prisoners of war, soldiers and officers of the Polish Army

- Were there any foreigners in the camp (nationality, number)?

- Average number of prisoners in the camp: 2,000–18,000 people

About 60,000 people

- What happened with the prisoners upon liquidation of the camp? They were deported to POW camps in Germany.
- 11. Did the prisoners work in the camp? (types of work performed, types of workshops) No
- 12. Did the prisoners work outside the camp? (types of work performed, locations) No
- 13. How were the prisoners fed?

People were so starved that they would fight for raw potatoes delivered to the camp kitchen by the Polish Red Cross posts. The camp command did not feed the prisoners. The prisoners were fed solely by the local community through the Polish Red Cross.

14. Was there an infirmary or a hospital in the camp?

There was an insufficient infirmary.

15. Where there any epidemics in the camp? (If yes, what kind)

Dysentery. The sick were sent to the Polish Red Cross hospital in Kielce, where approximately 40 people died per day. Sanitary conditions were extremely poor. Some prisoners slept on dung in the stables and some in the open air, regardless of weather.
